REGIONAL ADVISORY COUNCIL SELECTION OF FY 2024-2025 CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR

ACTIC/TLO UPDATE

Gabe Saenz with the Phoenix Fire Department provided an update on the ACTIC/TLO initiative, discussing the restructuring of field operations guide within the TLO program. He also shared TLO's classification information and highlighted the training opportunities available for TLO classification in remote areas, as well as the ongoing efforts to broaden the scope of training.

STATE HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM (SHSGP) PROJECT SUCCESS STORIES

Jeremy Kennedy with the Daisy Mountain Fire Department shared the outcomes of funding the CERT program. The CERT program has had a significant impact in the community. By supporting Fire Corps and implementing weekly shift duties for a certified team in a state of readiness, the program has been able to train hundreds of volunteers. In addition, the program has played a vital role in supporting community events and building resilience through deployments related to both natural and human causes. Furthermore, the program has provided valuable trainings to further enhance the skills and preparedness of its team. Melissa Deming with the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office shared the vision and results of the Domestic Violent Extremist (DVE) Analyst Project. She provided insight into the work produced by the analyst, including event briefs, preparations for upcoming events, and the organizational structure of the position. Mike Zelle with the Phoenix Police Department discussed the results of the funding for ARIA RAID project. He detailed the project's primary goal, assets acquired through the funding, contributions from the City of Phoenix, project sustainability, the lifespan of the technology, integration with other agencies and new developments with the technology. Nate Young with the Maricopa County Elections Office presented the results of the MCTEC Security Upgrade 2022/2023 Project, highlighting the proactive measures taken to strengthen the security of critical elections equipment and data infrastructure. These included updates to the voter registration system, the implementation of database security software enhancements, the installation of external lighting to ensure 24/7 building security, and the hiring of a contractor to revamp the electronic voting system.
