NSGP-NSS

National Security Supplemental – Separate Appropriation

\$210M NSGP-NSS Funding Allocation

- \$105,000,000/Urban Areas
- \$105,000,000/States

\$52.5 M – Set Aside for Consortium Applications

- \$26,250,000/Urban Areas
- \$26,250,000/States

\$142,800,000 - Funding for Individual NSGP- NSS

- \$71,400,000/Urban Areas
- \$71,400,000/States

NSGP-NSS

- Target/Facility-hardening Security Enhancements
 - Nexus to terrorism/extremism
 - Supplemental Additional funding appropriated/Israel-Hamas war
- Reimbursement Grant

KEY DIFFERENCES FROM NSGP

- Separate Funding Source/**Separate Investment Justification Application**
- \$200,000 Maximum per location
 - 3 sites per funding stream (UA or State), not to exceed \$600,00 total
- Allows for **Consortium Applications** (Group Application)
 - Group of nonprofit organizations/Lead Consortium Nonprofit
 - \$1M Maximum Award
- Bonus Points (4x Multiplier) for nonprofit organizations facing a heightened threat resulting from the Israel-Hamas war (Must make clear connection)
- **No bonus points** for applicants that have not previously received NSGP funding

CONSORTIUM APPLICATIONS

- Allows for Consortium Applications (Group Application)
 - Group of nonprofit organizations/ Lead Consortium Nonprofit
 - Investment Justification Complete one form
 - Workbook Complete one workbook
 - Provides additional information regarding nonprofit organizations in the Consortium
 - \$1M Maximum (limited to \$200,000 maximum per nonprofit)
- May submit one (I) Vulnerability Assessment or individual vulnerability assessments for each nonprofit in consortium
- May submit one (I) Arizona Supplement form for consortium as Lead Consortium Nonprofit or one for each nonprofit

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- 1. Only nonprofit organizations as described under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (IRC), exempt from tax under section 501(a) of such code may apply.
 - For Nonprofit Security Grant Program-National Security Supplemental Urban Area (NSGP-NSS-UA) be located within one of the FFY 2024 UASI-designated urban areas;
 - If nonprofit organization is the Phoenix-metro area (Maricopa County), it would apply under the Phoenix UA
 - Nonprofit Security Grant Program Program-National Security Supplemental Urban Area State (NSGP-NSS-S) be located outside of the FFY 2024 Urban Area Security Initiative(UASI)-designated urban area
 - Outside Phoenix metro/Maricopa County
- 2. Be able to demonstrate, through the application, that the organization is at high risk of a terrorist or other extremist attack

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA (CONT.)

- 3. Eligible nonprofit organizations may apply for an award amount
 - a) Up to \$200,000 per site under the NSGP-UA (Competitive Nationwide)
 - b) Up to \$200,000 per site under the NSGP-S (Competitive within State Allocation)
 - c) Three/3 per funding stream not to exceed \$600,000 total
 - i. Six (6) Maximum number of applications per nonprofit organization
 - ii. One application per location
 - d) Cannot apply for both UA and S (Same location)
 - i. Application funding source based on location
- 4. Consortium Applications (\$52.5 set aside for both NSS UA & S applications)
 - a) Up to \$1M maximum (limited to \$200,000 maximum per nonprofit within consortium)
 - b) Lead Consortium fiduciary for application/Manage all components (EHP, procurement, etc.)
 - c) Must comply with Build America, Buy America Act for awards of more than \$250,000
 - a) For more information, see Section H.3.a of the NOFO
- 5. Applicant must provide a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)

WHAT TYPE OF ENTITIES/ORGANIZATIONS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO APPLY UNDER NSGP?

- Utility Companies
- For-profit transportation entities/companies
- For-profit hospitals, Public schools (elementary, middle, or high schools)
- For-profit colleges/universities
- For-profit public venues, stadiums, amusement parks
- Organizations active in politics/lobbying
- Volunteer Fire Departments
- Community Service Organizations (Kiwanis, Rotary, Lions Clubs, etc.)
- Homeowner associations, labor, agricultural, or horticultural organizations
- Governmental Entities

ARIZONA APPLICATION PACKAGE

Must include the following:

I. Application Form – NSGP-NSS - Investment Justification (and Consortium workbook if applicable)
(ONLY DOCUMENT FORWARDED TO FEMA)

<u>Download and save form first</u>. Close out of browser. Then open the form from the saved location.

- 2. Arizona NSGP-NSS Supplemental Forms (Excel doc 7 tabs)
- 3. Vulnerability Assessment (No standardized form)
 - Options for obtaining a vulnerability assessment are posted on website
 - Must have been completed within the last 5 years
 - FYI Assessments take time to complete depending upon available staff

Submission Deadline: December 13, 2024 by 5:00 p.m.

RECOMMENDED ORDER OF IMPORTANCE/COMPLETION

- I. Request a vulnerability assessment if you do not already have one
 - a. Application is based on vulnerability assessment
 - b. Options listed on website at https://azdohs.gov/nsgp-nss
 - c. Assessments are good for 5 years in Arizona if no significant changes have occurred
- 2. Acquire a **Unique Entity Identifier** (UEI) number if you don't have one already
 - a. SAM.gov
- 3. Download and save **Investment Justification** application form and **AZ Supplemental Form** and begin **drafting responses for NSGP-NSS**

ALLOWABLE COST CATEGORIES

- Planning
- Equipment
- > Training
- > Exercise
- Contracted Security Personnel
- Indirect Costs
- Management and Administration (M&A)

PLANNING

Funding may be used for security or emergency planning expenses and the materials required to conduct planning activities. Planning must be related to the protection of the facility and the people within the facility and should include access and functional needs as well as those with limited English proficiency.

Examples of planning activities allowable under this program include:

- I. Development and enhancement of security plans and protocols;
 - Emergency contingency plans;
 - Evacuation/Shelter-in-place plans;
 - Emergency response plans

EQUIPMENT

Allowable costs are focused on target hardening and physical security enhancements. Funding can be used for the acquisition and installation of security equipment on real property (including buildings and improvements) owned or leased by the nonprofit organization, specifically in prevention of and/or protection against the risk of a terrorist or other extremist attack.

- Video Surveillance Systems (security cameras)
 - Cameras for Facial recognition or License Plate Reader software is not allowed
- Bollards
- Fencing
- Impact Resistant Film/Windows
- Access Control Systems
- Security enhanced doors/windows

TRAINING & EXERCISE

- **Training** limited to an organization's security personnel, staff, members and volunteers only
 - **■** Security-related
 - Applications should include specific details about proposed training <u>– to include topic</u>, organization attendees/participants, length, and vulnerability the activity will help mitigate
 - Limited to protection of critical infrastructure/key resources
 - Examples: Terrorism awareness/employee preparedness (Community Emergency Response Team), Active Shooter, emergency first aid.

Exercise

- Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP) provides a set of guiding principles for conducting exercises
 - After Action Report/Improvement Plan

CONTRACTED SECURITY PERSONNEL

- Contracted Security **must** be acquired through a **competitive process**
 - <u>Cannot</u> directly hire individual off-duty law enforcement personnel
- Allowable if not already included in current operating budget
- May <u>not</u> use the NSGP-NSS funding to <u>hire full or part-time employees</u> that will be placed on a nonprofit's payroll.
- NSGP-NSS funds may <u>not</u> be used to purchase equipment for contracted security

MANAGEMENT & ADMINISTRATION (M&A) – INDIRECT COSTS

- M&A activities are those costs defined as directly relating to the management and administration of NSGP funds such as financial management and monitoring
 - Hiring of full-time or part-time staff or contractors/consultants responsible for activities relating to the management and administration of NSGP funds
 - Meeting-related expenses directly related to M&A of NSGP funds
 - Up to 5% of total award
 - Note: M&A allowable costs are typically those costs incurred that relate directly to financial paperwork, AZDOHS monitoring meetings or requests for information after a project is underway.
 - Example: quarterly reports, reimbursement preparation and submission
 - Acquiring quotes, selecting a vendor, managing contractors and equipment installation are considered project management and would not be allowable expenditures under the M&A category.

APPLICATION - INVESTMENT JUSTIFICATION

Responses in each section should address all components in the description.

*Application Form/Investment Justification and Consortium Workbook (if applicable) are **ONLY** items forwarded for Federal review

III. Risk – Nexus to Terrorism/Extremism

Threat

- Identification or specific threats against nonprofit or closely related organization by a terrorist organization
- Include findings from risk assessment, police findings or claims that may have been made at the location

Vulnerability

• What are the specific vulnerabilities that expose your facility/location to potential impact from a terrorist or other extremist attack?

Potential Consequences

What would happen as a result of an attack? What's the potential impact to your facility, the organization and the people it serves?

IV. Facility Hardening (2 parts)

- Narrative fully describe target-hardening activities, associated costs and link to vulnerability assessment
 - Example: Fencing 240 feet of 8-foot chain-link fencing topped with 1 foot of barbed wire addressing the vulnerability to breach/access the facility along the west side. (AEL# 14SW-01-WALL)

240 feet
$$\times$$
 \$208.33 per foot = \$50,000

• Example: \$5,000 for 8 exterior cameras, 3 located on lighting poles in parking lot, I adjacent to the main entrance, and I on each corner of the building (4) to address the current inability to monitor the exterior of the facility and identify suspicious activity to prevent or protect from an incident.

$$8 \text{ cameras} \times \$625 = \$5,000$$

- Authorized Equipment List (AEL) Grid at bottom of Facility Hardening section - Planning, Exercise, Contract Security, and M&A are listed at the bottom of the drop-down menu but will not have an associated AEL.
 - Training: AEL# 21GN-00-TRNG

V. Milestones (May I – April 30)

Common milestone include, but are not limited to:

Steps/Dates that sequentially build upon each other toward project completion

VII.Impact

- Measurable outputs and outcomes
 - Scoring Criteria should directly link to the vulnerabilities and consequences described in Section III.
 - Be descriptive and address each of the vulnerabilities and consequences
 - Example questions to consider: Is there anything that can be measured to determine a projected output/outcome? Does it reduce unauthorized access by XX% because there was no locking mechanism previously?

ARIZONA NSGP-NSS SUPPLEMENTAL FORM - PROJECT DETAIL SHEET - TAB 2

- Recommend getting estimates as a basis for the costs
 - Consider potential cost increases
- Do not use the Authorized Equipment List (AEL) description as your description.
- Do not use brand names of vendors or equipment
- Quantities Suggest you round up when applicable (Example: Number identified in estimate(s) is 18, round up to 20) If awarded, number of items should not exceed estimated number in Project Detail Sheet
 - # of cameras, # of doors, lineal feet of fence, # of bollards, etc.

ARIZONA NSGP-NSS SUPPLEMENTAL FORM — VULNERABILITY ASSESSMENT QUESTIONNAIRE — TAB 3

- Responses will be used to assess Need & Impact as compared to other applications
- Site must be currently occupied & utilized by the organization (not used as a residence or being remodeled/built for future use)
- Vulnerability Assessment
 - Must have been completed within the last 5 years
 - If using an assessment completed prior to current year, you must describe any enhancements made since assessment was completed

NSGP APPLICATION REVIEW

- AZDOHS review
 - Equipment (Allowable)
 - Nonprofit Organization Eligibility
 - Nonprofit status
 - Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) number
 - Vulnerability Assessment
 - Project Elements are Supported by Assessment
 - Scoring
 - Need and Impact
- FEMA Conducts Review on Investment Justification (application), Consortium Workbook ONLY
 - Review, Scoring, Bonus Points
 - **Note:** No bonus points for applicants that have never received funding

APPLICATION & AWARD PROCESS

- Application/Investment Justification reviewed and scored at State level (AZDOHS)
 - Ineligible or incomplete applications or applications with unallowable equipment may not be recommended for federal review
- NSGP-NSS UA Applications Reviewed by UASI committee/group
 - Need compared to other applicants and
 - Impact how effectively the proposed project addresses the identified need
- Federal Review
 - Reviewed and scored by Federal Staff
 - Federal reviewers' scores will be multiplied:
 - · By a factor of three for nonprofit groups at high risk of terrorist attacks due to their ideology-based/spiritual/religious
 - By a factor of two for medical and educational institutions; and
 - · By a factor of one for all other nonprofit organizations
 - 10 Bonus Points for underserved populations
 - +4 /Nonprofits facing heightened threat resulting from the Israel-Hamas war
 - Final determinations will be made by the Secretary of Homeland Security
- Awards Announcement anticipated by May 1, 2025
 - All applicants will be notified via email
- Official Awards Made Upon AZDOHS Receipt of DHS Award to State Period of Performance
 - Anticipated to be May 1, 2025 April 30, 2026

TAKEAWAYS

- **AZ Application Package 3-4 items to be submitted**
 - I. Investment Justification Application
 - 2. Consortium Workbook if applying as a Consortium
 - 3. Vulnerability Assessment
 - 4. Arizona Supplemental Form
- Application <u>must</u> be supported by vulnerability assessment
- Investment Justification (Application) stands alone
 - FEMA receives the Investment Justification ONLY (+ Consortium Workbook if applicable)
- Clearly express risk or a nexus to potential terrorist or other extremist attack
- Include Authorized Equipment List (AEL) numbers for equipment items, no brand names or vendor names
 - AEL numbers are <u>not</u> required for Planning, Exercise, Contracted Security, M&A; however, listed at the bottom of the AEL dropdown menu
- Incomplete application (blanks) reduces score
- Review your application with the Evaluation Criteria Scoring (Appendix A of NOFO) prior to submission
- **Save the Investment Justification application file** using the following naming convention:
 - For NSGP-NSS-UA
 - NSGP-NSS_UA_AZ_Phoenix_<Nonprofit Name>
 - For NSGP-NSS-S
 - NSGP-NSS_S_AZ_<Nonprofit Name>
 - Consortium Applications
 - NSGP-NSS_UA_AZ_Phoenix_<Consortium Lead Name>
 - NSGP-NSS_S_AZ_<Consortium Lead Name>
